Description: The Berkshire Soccer Academy is an overnight soccer camp for girls. We offer an elite training experience for girls, ages 9-16, in a traditional camp setting on a private lake in the Berkshires.

The Cooking Instructor will plan, prepare, and teach one-hour classes to 5-20 campers 1-2 times per day; manage and organize all materials; and enforce camp rules and standards. The Cooking Instructor will live in a cabin with 8-12 campers as their Cabin Counselor (see job description below), alongside 1-2 other counselors.

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Cabin Counselor

Description: The Berkshire Soccer Academy is an overnight soccer camp for girls. We offer an elite training experience for girls, ages 9-16, in a traditional camp setting on a private lake in the Berkshires.

Cabin Counselors live in newly-renovated, pine-paneled cabins with 1-2 other counselors and 8-12 campers. All cabins include electricity, full bathrooms, and screened windows. Campers are grouped by age in cabins, ranging from 9-16 years old. Cabin Counselors are responsible for the overall well-being of each camper, being a positive mentor and role model, and collaborating with Resident Life Leaders to address any needs or concerns.

Cabin Counselors undergo a week-long training before camp begins that covers Academy protocol, child development, and more. A typical day for a Cabin Counselor can begin as early as 6:30AM, and end as late as 10:30PM. This includes eating all meals with your campers, accompanying them throughout camp, and collaborating with Residential Life Leaders to ensure campersqueeds are met.
